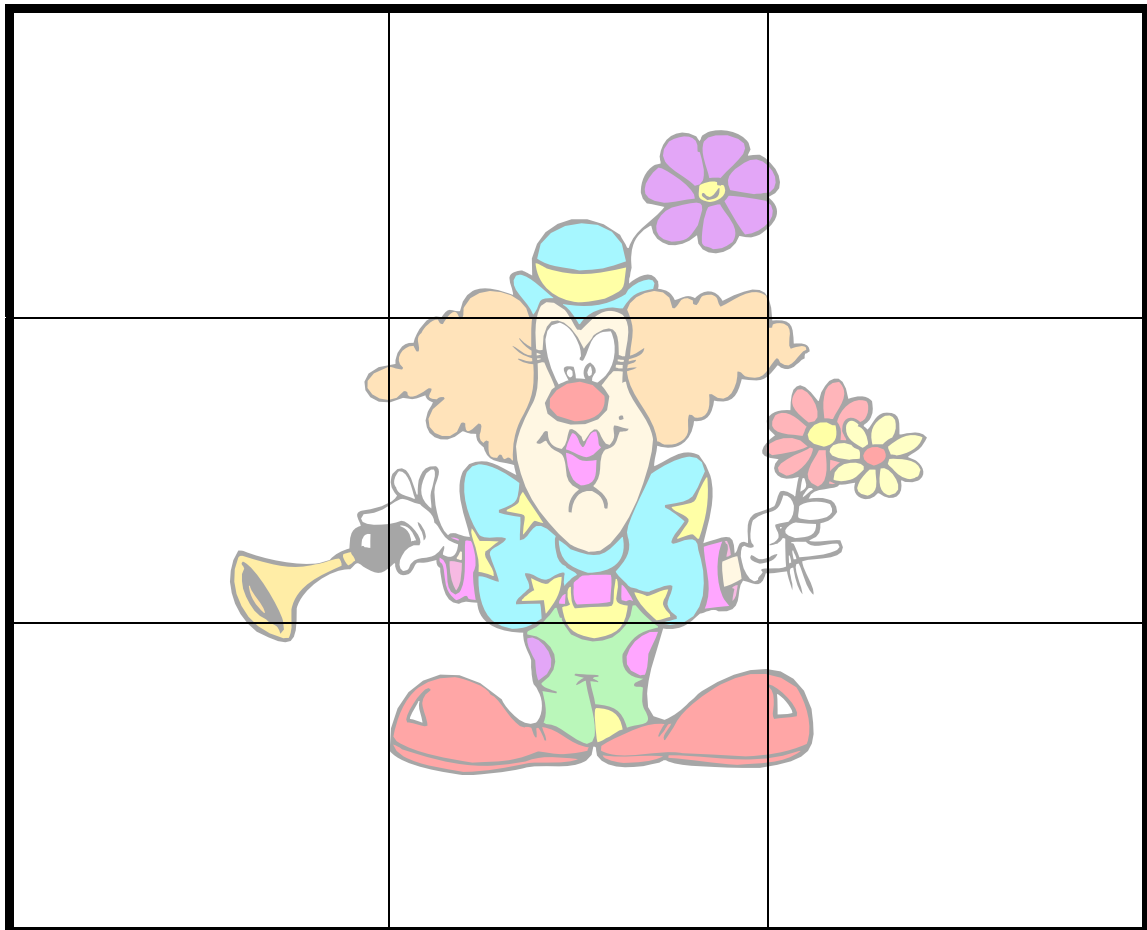


# crazy comparative Bingo!



In the squares above, first write down these things...

**Dogs, my house, cars, fast food, Mr. Miya, Ian, coca-cola, Me, trees**

Now write a 'O' or a 'X' in the boxes.

# For Teachers

Students place the adjectives of their choice into the squares and then write O or X in each square. This relates to their preference of items. They then go round the class asking “Which do you like better \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_?” The students make a sentence by comparing the two items. They have to make some kind of comparison for the two items and then all students who also have that item as the winner(O)/loser(X) can cross off the items from their bingo.

This game can be pretty quick so play until many people have bingo. It works well for small classes.

When using these worksheets in your class be aware that they are the worksheets that I used in my class printed here as is and as such use vocabulary and grammar appropriate to the students that I was teaching at the time. If you plan to use this or any other sheet in your class make sure that you have pre-taught all the vocabulary necessary or preferably, use the ideas here and rewrite the worksheet for your specific students needs.
